1. Welcome & Introductions

Matt Gill – Board Chair welcomed everyone and asked for introductions.

2. <u>Corporation for Public Broadcasting Funding Updates from Jeff Owens, WEIU General</u> Manager

Overview... WEIU-TV funding issue. The House and Senate approved a Continuing Resolution (CR) for Fiscal Year 2025, extending funding for public media. The legislation provides \$535 million for CPB in Fiscal Year 2027, upholding the two-year advance appropriation for public media. So we are assuming our main CSG grant will be released each of the next two fiscal years. In addition, we have enough cash based on saving money from the covid cares grants for at least one full calendar year as well. So if CPB gets defunded, WEIU would be entering a critical time where over the next 3 years we would have serious issues to resolve as WEIU and for you on this board. There is even a worst-case scenario where the current administration doesn't honor the forward funding and defunds CPB, which would give us only a year or so based on what we have in reserve. President Gatrell, VP Hendrickson and our incoming VP Dr. Farley are aware of all these scenarios. I have begun to make plans for all doomsday scenarios – 1, 2 or 3 years, while hoping the current congress approves CPB for FY 2028 in "our world." We would also be asking this board for recommendations, ideas and action if CPB gets defunded. We will be keeping you updated via email when important items occur. The one thing we are doing as a staff... is staying focused on what we can control, which is stay true to our mission, which is serving EIU and our audiences and the education of EIU students. Local programming, live radio and being a source of information to our audiences is our focus. One thing to note if you watched the hearing last week, that was said but not discussed. PBS's programming for TV is 10% of what we do.

CPB/Budget Questions – Discussion

Walus – Question on goals and how to treat upcoming years.

Owens – Control what we can control, continue to provide locally produced programs, serve EIU students and the community as we are now. Determine what changes or transitions need to be discussed or made dependent on information we receive moving forward.

WEIU is 25% PBS and has other programming resources such as APT and NETA, not sure where the give may need to be moving forward, is dependent on Congress and upcoming Administration.

Lau – Has State funding increased?

Owens – we are still receiving Illinois Arts Council money with no increase for upcoming year. Not sure about any possible funding from FEMA or IEMA based on current administration decisions. There may be a possibility for program sharing among stations through a collaborative grant in the future.

Armstrong- mentioned Protect My Public Media as an advocate for public broadcasting stations. There is information available for viewers and or employees to search on their own time and personal computers.

Owens – discussed the FCC investigation and that we are working with our FCC lawyer to make sure WEIU remains compliant.

3. Local Productions

Being Well Season 17 and The Paw Report Season 14 finished airing. Both of those shows will begin taping their next seasons here in May/June.

City Spotlight continues taping episodes in Season 11. Just recently, City Spotlight did an online only segment on Neoga Schools following the tornado that damaged both Neoga School buildings.

WEIU aired its 19th Our Story program this past December, featuring the community of Altamont. #20 will air in July 2026 – 40 years of WEIU-TV

Fall EIU Commencement ceremonies was streamed by WEIU this past December. WEIU will stream EIU Spring Commencement ceremonies on 5/10.

WEIU streamed EIU President Gatrell's Spring Update on 1/22 from the Doudna Fine Arts Center.

Take a Hike Season 4 will debut on 4/21 on WEIU. Production for Take a Hike takes place in the previous Fall.

School Talk Season 3 is currently taping new segments. The new season will debut on 5/02.

7. WEIU-TV Programming

Programming: We are a PDP station which means we air 25% PBS programs and 75% non-PBS programming – NETA, APT, and local productions. We would use more of the NETA and APT programming to replace PBS shows. PBS also may allow us to continue airing older programs for a while, this will be decided if worst comes to worst. We could also air repeats of our local shows we produce over the next year as well. We have worked on a non-PBS TV schedule, and we can fill the time to maintain full time broadcasting operations.

Walus – What percent of the budget is News Watch?

Owens – It's significant, but important to remain a part of WEIU as it serves students daily. There are costs associated with the equipment, weather, Associated Press, etc.

Gill – what do we know about NOAA and weather alerts/updates.

Owens/Lau – this is dependent on the current Administration's future decisions

Craig – discussed weather with Lincoln, IL staff and potential changes in the future

Owens – Illinois public broadcasting stations collaboration may become more important

Craig – further discussed weather, the government decisions and effects on viewers

Owens – 51.6 has become a real source for weather related events for viewers.

Craig – discussed recent severe weather live break ins on WEIU from current News Watch students.

Important for training as well as to inform viewers.

Owens – WEIU is a training ground for students and need to continue to offer hands on training Gill – discussed the recent PBS/NPR hearing and hasn't heard much about the response.

Owens – agreed, not much response and mentioned that we were proud of Paula Kerger – President of PBS. 10% of PBS is news. WEIU TV produces our own local news program – News Watch and we provide children's programming and educational programming. We serve the university and a 22-county broadcast area.
